

The Educators Award Committee (DKG International) is charged with the responsibility of selecting an appropriate book as winner of the annual Educators Award.

The committee recognizes women authors whose educational research and writing potentially impact the thoughts and actions of today's complex society. The Society presents an award of \$2,500 to the author(s) of a book selected by the committee.

2018 Educators Book Award Winner



Teaching Controversial Issues: The Case for Critical Thinking and Moral Commitment in the Classroom

In this book, eminent educational philosopher Nel Noddings and daughter Laurie Brooks explain how teachers can foster critical thinking through the exploration of controversial issues. They offer specific, concrete strategies for addressing a variety of issues related to authority, religion, gender, race, media, sports, entertainment, class and poverty, capitalism and socialism, and equality and justice. The emphasis is on the use of critical thinking to understand and collaborate, not simply to win arguments.

Book Features:

- Underscores the necessity of moral commitment in the use of critical thinking.
- Offers assistance for handling controversial issues that many teachers find unsettling.
- Proposes a way for students and teachers to work together across the disciplines.

Nel Noddings is Lee Jacks Professor of Education, Emerita, at Stanford University. Her books include Education and Democracy in the 21st Century, When School Reform Goes Wrong, The Challenge to Care in Schools, Educating Citizens for Global Awareness, Educating for Intelli-gent Belief or Unbelief, and Educating Moral People.

Laurie Brooks is on the board of Provident Financial Services and serves on advisory boards for programs at North Carolina State and Rutgers Universities.

From the Introduction: This book is an invitation to teachers to think and to explore ways in which to promote critical thinking in their students.
