A Message from our President

Wow! It is November already. In recent months I have heard people say, "I am done with 2020!" Those words have come from individuals who have only experienced a few minor inconveniences related to the pandemic and natural disasters. None of them have experienced a life-altering event such as losing their job or home. I hope you are taking a different approach—one that is positive and encouraging in spite of the world around us. Alpha Rho Chapter chooses to focus on how we can serve and give back to others, not only in the months of November and December, but also throughout the year.

Our October meeting was held at the <u>Renesting Project</u>. Supporting this community-oriented program is our Fleur de lis project for 2020-2021. After the abbreviated installation of officers and business meeting, Noel Haacker, Founder and Executive Director, shared the project's history and an overview of its role in the community.

Noel explained that volunteers reclaim and renew used furniture and household goods. These items are then renested to provide for those in need–free of charge. Renesting serves many sectors of our community as indicated on the non-profit organization's website:

Together we serve a very diverse cross section of our community: school children, mentally or physically disabled persons, domestic violence survivors, homeless Veterans, among others.

Our goal is to improve the quality of life of those we serve as they transition into permanent housing by providing basic furniture and household items needed to function with dignity.

Noel guided us through the facilities and explained how donations are repurposed. She demonstrated the efficiency of the program by explaining how the procedures have been streamlined so that volunteers can maximize their time in preparing boxes for distribution. We participated by preparing small bags of laundry pods so they are ready to be boxed with other laundry essentials. It was an eye-opening experience to get a glimpse of how individuals' basic needs can be met, but only if the resources are available to be distributed.

How can you support this cause? First, you can <u>donate</u>. Donations of money, furniture and household items support the efforts to provide basic needs. Second, you can <u>volunteer</u> on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and the second Saturday of the month. Lastly, you can share the good things that are happening through this project. Sharing the needs and purpose of this valuable community resource with others expands the opportunities for Renesting to meet the needs of many more. By taking action through donating, volunteering, or sharing, we help to meet the needs of our community including our students and their families.

In closing, I hope that you will plan to join us November 16th at BESC and December 12 for a Christmas brunch at Martha's house.
